Mr. James Reppert was interviewed for membership on the Board of Architectural Review. Council concurred that legislation be prepared for such appointment.

Mr. Kenning reviewed two petitions received, one for and one against, concerning the RTA turn around through the Centerville Plat. Fourteen residents are opposed, 13 in favor of, and 11 unaccounted for along the roadway involved. Council concurred that a postcard survey be made during the first two weeks in August to solicit the expression of those residents involved.

Mr. Kenning reviewed the lighting plan and sign proposed for the Huntington Bank located on Loop Road in Centerville.

Mr. Kenning outlined traffic counts and accidents at the intersection of Thomas Paine Parkway and Bigger Road in consideration of a traffic signal at said intersection. Council concurred that a signal is not warranted at this time.

Mr. Kenning reviewed the status of Human Services for 1981, outside funding is being solicited.

Mr. Kenning gave an update report on property acquisition along the improvement of Cloyo Road. Mr. Sweetman suggested that traffic be detoured off Cloyo Road except for residents living there, while the roadway is under construction. He emphasized the dangerous situation at the temporary by-pass. Council concurred that the traffic situation be reviewed during the coming week.

Mayor Stone announced a reception being held Monday, July 28, 1980 at 10:00 A.M. in the Centerville Municipal Building for visitors and a soccer team from Aschaffenberg, Germany.

Council concurred to pursue Waterloo, Canada as a Sister City.
