Jeff Nye, Roger Lucas and Ozzie Fishman, Members of the Centerville-Washington Township Chamber of Commerce, appeared to discuss with Council the closing of Main Street during the Americana Festival to be held July 7, 1979. Plans for the event were briefly reviewed. Council requested that merchants who would be affected by the closing of said street be contacted and their feelings be expressed to Council before final action is taken to close the street. Mr. Sweetman would like to see the merchant's reactions in writing. Upon question of Mrs. Lake, Mr. Nye advised that the Chamber is hopeful that the City will defray the cost of extra police services during that day.

Mr. Robert Archdeacon, from the Ralph L. Woolpert and representing Standard Oil Company, was present to discuss with Council curb cuts and signage for the Standard-Wilmington Plat. Mayor Green pointed out the fact that previously Council had approved the Preliminary Plan for this Development which did not include approval of curb cuts. An Attorney from Columbus, representing Standard Oil agreed with Mayor Green's statement. The Developer will proceed with the necessary Applications for curb cuts and signs, these Applications will be submitted and follow regular procedure.


Mr. Kenning reviewed proposed changes in the Agreement between the City of Centerville and the Cable TV Council:

That membership be increased to include Greene County.

That the annual audit become permissive rather than mandatory.

Mrs. Lake expressed concern with expanding the Council to include Greene County. She encouraged accomplishments on a Regional or Countywide basis. Necessary legislation will be prepared.

Council discussed the issuance of Industrial Revenue Bonds. Mayor Green pointed out the fact that this a method by which the City can encourage business in Centerville. Mr. Siler suggested that an expert on this subject be invited to speak to Council during a future Council Work Session Meeting.
