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Mr. Stone advised that the Ad Hoc Committee concerning the Temple Property has met. Further plans are being made for the development of the property.

Mr. Sweetman briefed Council on the hook-up of Cable TV in the City of Centerville, hook-ups are being made in places requiring overhead installation. The next Cable TV Council Meeting has been scheduled for January 18, 1978 at the Moraine Civic Center.

# CARRIAGE SOUTH

The Public Hearing was held concerning a Conditional Use Request to permit the development of a condominium project in an Entrance Corridor zoned area. Mr. Reynolds located the property on a map and reviewed the Request. Said property being situated along the west side of Bigger Road, south of the primary boulevard into Carriage South, and consisting of 4.63 acres of land, 27 units proposed at a density of 5621 square feet per dwelling unit, for a total of 243 units in the entire development. The Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of this Preliminary Plan.

Nancy York, owner of the property in front of the subject land, questioned how close to her property line, units would be constructed. Mr. Robert Archdeacon, from the Ralph L. Woolpert Company and representing the developer, advised that the units will be at least 35 feet from the rear property line.

Mr. Reynolds advised that the entrance into this area should be realigned to provide better access onto the primary boulevard.

Mr. Sweetman moved that Council approved the Conditional Use to develop a condominium project in an Entrance Corridor zoned area, subject to the entrance into the project being in line with the break in the primary boulevard leading into Carriage South. Mr. Stone seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion; Mr. Siler abstained.

### ORDINANCE NUMBER 57-77 APPROPRIATIONS 1977

The Public Hearing was held concerning Ordinance Number 57-77. Mr. Kenning reviewed the proposed Ordinance, it reappropriates funds for the year 1977. Under Item 112 Animal Warden a typographical error was corrected to read as follows: 204 - Holiday Pay 275; 211 - Public Employees Retirement 1110. Mr. Stubbs sponsored Ordinance Number 57-77, An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance 71-76, To Make Appropriations For Current Expenses And Other Expenditures Of The City Of Centerville, State Of Ohio, During The Fiscal Year Ending December 31, 1977, and moved that it be passed. Mr. Singer seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in seven ayes in favor of the motion.

# ORDINANCE NUMBER 61-77 WASTE COLLECTION

The Public Hearing was held concerning Ordinance Number 61-77. Mr. Kenning reviewed the proposed Ordinance which changes the service to curb line pick up and increases the rate by \$.50, for waste collection by the City of Centerville. The Ordinances also provides for a fee for chipper service and special pickups.

Mr. Robert Kilian, 2249 East Alexandersville-Bellbrook Road, finds it an inconvenience to carry his waste to the street, he believes that there should be some reconsideration for those residents living a long distance from the road. He suggested increasing the property tax in order to pay for waste collection, thus receiving credit on the Federal Income Tax return. Mr. Sweetman suggested that Council further review situations comparative to that described by Mr. Kilian. Mayor Green suggested that the City Manager be authorized to use good judgment in giving exemptions for long distances. Mr. Stubbs suggested that Council develop a Policy concerning this matter.

Stubbs suggested that Council develop a Policy concerning this matter. Mr. Carlton Milbrandt, 7111 Bigger Lane, finds it inconvenient to set waste out at curb line by 7:30 AM. He would like to see current service continued in the City of Centerville. He encouraged no additional fee for Minutes of

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special pick-up. He also endorsed an increase in tax for waste collection. Joy Dixon, 505 Clareridge Lane, objected to curb service in consideration

of the entire Community. With the tearing of bags by wind and animals, she fears a dirty Community.

Mr. John McIntire, 200 Weller Avenue, reviewed the philosophy developed concerning waste collection when the City service began. He believes that City services should not be reduced, he asked Council to reconsider these proposed changes in waste collection and to make the decisions. Mayor Green advised that his comments will be considered during a future Council Work Session Meeting.

A student from the Centerville High School suggested that a dual service be considered to provide curb line in subdivisions where drives are short, and house line pick up in other areas having long driveways.

Mr. Stubbs would prefer trying the alternative which he proposed for Council's consideration at a previous Meeting concerning waste collection. He reviewed the bids received in April, 1977 from private haulers and now wonders if perhaps that might have been the direction the City should have taken. Discussion followed concerning the increase in fee, the change in service and why all this is necessary.

Mr. Stone sponsored Ordinance Number 61-77, An Ordinance Amending Chapter 959 Of The Municipal Code Relating To Changes In Services And Rates, and moved that it be passed. Mrs. Lake seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion; Mr. Stubbs abstained.

# ORDINANCE NUMBER 59-77 PERSONNEL

The Public Hearing was held concerning Ordinance Number 59-77. Mr. Kenning reviewed the proposed Ordinance which provides a 7% annual adjustment to the salary and wage plan for employees of the City of Centerville. It includes no change in fringe benefits. Mr. Singer sponsored Ordinance Number 59-77, An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance 73-76 To Establish Class Titles, Pay Grades, Rates Of Pay, And Regulations For Employees Of The City Of Centerville, Ohio, and moved that it be passed. Mrs. Lake seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in seven ayes in favor of the motion.

#### ORDINANCE NUMBER 63-77 APPROPRIATIONS

The Public Hearing was held concerning Ordinance Number 63-77. Mr. Kenning gave a brief overview of the proposed Budget for 1978. Mr. Sweetman suggested that this Budget presentation be given from time to time during the year. Mayor Green suggested that the February issue of the Town Crier be a Budget newsletter. Mr. Stone sponsored Ordinance Number 63-77, An Ordinance To Make Appropriations For Current Expenses And Other Expenditures Of The City Of Centerville, State Of Ohio, During The Fiscal Year Ending December 31, 1978, and moved that it be passed. Mr. Sweetman seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in seven ayes in favor of the motion.

#### **RESOLUTION NUMBER 1-78 APPRECIATION**

Mrs. Lake sponsored Resolution Number 1-78, A Resolution of Appreciation To Ralph Spencer, and moved that it be passed. Mr. Sweetman seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in seven ayes in favor of the motion.

A roll call vote resulted in seven ayes in favor of the motion.
