The Meeting was opened by Mayor Green reviewing the purpose of the Meeting: to informally discuss with the Trustees Council's position on separation dated June 28, 1977. A lengthy discussion followed concerning the pros and cons of Centerville's separation from Washington Township. Resulting from the discussion were three basic areas of concern and a need for joint cooperation:

Fire Department = Centerville's input into matters of the Fire Department, or the establishment of a Joint Fire District.

Revenue = Monies being paid by Centerville residents to Washington Township should be used to the benefit of Centerville residents.

Police Department=A Contract by Washington Township with the City of Centerville for Police Protection.

As a result of the Meeting, Mr. Snyder invited a Council Representative or Representatives to meet with him and the Fire Chief to discuss Fire Department matters. A Joint Fire District can be further discussed. City Council reviewed areas in which Township monies can be spent to the benefit of Centerville residents. The Township Trustees invited the City to bid on the Police Contract at the appropriate time. Mr. Snyder would go with City police protection only after listening to the desires of Township residents.
