## ORDINANCE NUMBER 39-76 STREET NAME CHANGE

Mr. Kenning reviewed the need for this clarification on the name of a street, there have been two names used for this street over previous years. Property owners on Haynes Road have agreed to this change. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

## RESOLUTION NUMBER 31-76 APPRECIATION

Mr. Stubbs sponsored and read Resolution Number 31-76, A Resolution Of Appreciation For The Work Of The Centerville Lions Club And Its Contribution To The Community And Public As A Whole, and moved that it be passed. Mr. Sweetman seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion. Mr. Ted Baker, President of the Centerville Lions Club, accepted the Resolution and thanked Council for their support in previous activities.

Councilman Charles McQueeney entered the Meeting at this time.

Mrs. Lake reviewed the Meeting she attended of the Operations Committee of MVRPC in which attempt is being made to bring all acceptance and work programs in line on fiscal year, thus only one budget cycle to work with.

Mrs. Lake brought for Council's consideration the fact that Montgomery County is protesting legislation being passed at the State level mandating expenditures without accompanying appropriations, perhaps this could be a coordinated effort through a Regional Agency since all Municipalities and Counties are effected. Mayor Green advised that this matter has been discussed during Mayors and Managers Association Meetings, the formation of a lobbying body has been proposed.
