Mr. Roscoe Lorton, Mr. Robert Amos, Mr. Michael Thill and Mr. Jeffrey Siler were interviewed as applicants for the Centerville Planning Commission. Council concurred that legislation be prepared to appoint Jeffrey Siler and said legislation be an agenda item for the next Council Meeting.

Mr. Philip Marriott was interviewed as an applicant for the Sister City Committee. Council concurred with the appointment of Mr. Marriott. Legislation will be before Council on March 1, 1976.

Mr. John Sullivan and Mr. Loren Gannon appeared to explain to Council their request for financial support to the Montgomery County Historical Society. Mr. Gannon reviewed what they have accomplished and can accomplish in the future for the City of Centerville. They are asking for \$624.00 for 1976, figure based on .0416 cents per person population. Council concurred to financially support the Montgomery County Historical Society in consideration of their benefit to the City of Centerville. Mr. Spencer and Mrs. Lake suggested that monies also be considered for the local Historical Society, perhaps the same amount.

Mrs. Lake reviewed a letter she drafted to be sent to Mr. William Boos, Chairperson for the Health Planning Council of Greater Miami Valley and which she intended to read at their Meeting held Wednesday, February 18, 1976. She reviewed this Meeting and read a cover letter to be sent with the above referred to letter.

A tax proposal to the residents of Centerville was discussed by Council. Mr. McQueeney encouraged Mayor Green to pursue reciprocity between Municipalities and the City of Dayton in consideration of Income Tax during the next Mayors and Managers Association Meeting. Council concurred that a 2 mill operating levy be put to the electors at the June Primary Election, to be split 1/2 for Police and 1/2 for Streets. The electors can then decide whether they are willing to pay additional tax dollars for additional services and Capital Improvements.

There being no further business, the Meeting was adjourned.
