Preston Dawes reviewed for Council South Montgomery County Youth Services November 1, 1975 through March 31, 1976 in and for residents of Centerville. He explained method used for evaluation.

Council directed the City Manager to arrange a joint Meeting with the Board of Architectural Review to discuss the proposed amendment to the Architectural Preservation Ordinance, said Meeting to be during the next Council Work Session.

Council concurred that a financial contribution be made in support of the County Commissioners intervention in the rate increase applied for by the Dayton Power and Light Company; the sum of money discussed was \$1,000.00.

The acquisition of the Temple Property was discussed. Mr. Kenning advised that there are two grants pending on this proposal: one for \$10,000.00 and one for \$55,000.00. The property was appraised at \$35,000.00 three years ago, it could possibly be near \$50,000.00 at present. Mr. Stubbs would like to see pros and cons from the staff concerning this acquisition. This matter will be an agenda item for the Council Work Session April 19, 1976.

Council concurred with providing City police service during the Ox-Roast.

The guard rail on Centerville Station Road was discussed by Council; cost of installation would be approximately \$3,450.00. It was concurred that this improvement be made through County \$5.00 monies or 7/10 mill Township monies. Mr. Kenning will puruse this matter.

Funding for the Miami Valley Regional Crime Lab was discussed. Council concurred with their request, funds to come from the Police Department at the present time.

Council concurred that \$258.32, as Centerville's share, be sent to the Miami Valley Disaster Services Authority toward financing their operations.

Mayor Green reviewed for Council revenue due the City of Centerville from Washington Township over the past three years, monies from 7/10 mill and Revenue Sharing Funds. A list of projects in the City of Centerville will be presented to the Trustees for their consideration, said projects will be presented during a Joint Meeting.
