Mr. Ernst outlined how Youth Programs in the Centerville-Washington Township Community come into being. Participents in the Creative Youth Magazine Award Program were present to receive first place awards in the various arts.

Mr. Kenning reviewed for Council the Federal L.E.A.A. Grant awarded the City of Centerville for a Youth Officer. First year funding has been approved, it would be necessary for the City to fund the second year if the project is to continue. Council concurred with Mr. Kenning's recommendation to accept first year funding in total.

The environmental swale in the Black Oak Forest Subdivision was discussed. Council concurred with the treatment of the swale as included in the Agreement for Section One.

Council concurred that sections of the Zoning Ordinance amendment be considered during Work Sessions, they be broken down into Residential, Business, etc. for Council's review.

Mr. Kenning advised that Waylo Representatives are willing to sell the property at Main and Franklin Streets or lease portions, but at a high cost. He recommended that a trip be made to Tulsa for further contact. Mr. Sweetman suggested that a phone call be made before the trip.

Councilman Leonard Stubbs entered the Meeting at this time.

Council concurred that recommendations of the Charter Review Committee be considered during a Council Work Session at which the Committee will be present.

Mr. Kenning reviewed Section 8, a new HUD Program providing rent supplement, Chevy Chase Park has applied for this assistance. Council concurred that comments be directed to HUD concerning Chevy Chase as Centerville does not have grounds to object to this application. Suggestions were offered by Council to be incorporated in the letter. Mayor Green

suggested that a HUD Official come to Centerville to hear the City's experience concerning Chevy Chase.
