Mr. Stubbs suggested discussing Recreation Coordination, Merger (City/Township) and the East Franklin Street Traffic Problem. Mrs. Lake suggested asking the School Board for City consideration when choosing school sites.

Mrs. Lake advised Council that she has given Carol Pucci her copy of the calendar survey.

Mr. Sweetman advised that this Meeting was designed to be interface between Council and School Board, a joint Meeting to discuss mutual problems.

Mr. Kenning explained the City's Johanna Drive extension proposal. This proposal was included in T.C.C.'s Center Sector Thoroughfare Plan for the City of Centerville of which some of the recommendations have been pursued. Mr. Schab reviewed the City's two proposals.

Mrs. Lake asked for consideration of the City when the School system proposes a new site, Planner and Planning Commission review.

Mrs. Lake suggested no left turns at the high school exit, perhaps this would held the traffic problem at peek periods. Mr. Schab did not believe this to be a full solution, this would help but would create other problems.

Chief Randolph sees the problem only moved to the Clyo Road-Centerville Station intersection if this was done.

Mr. Green suggested staggering beginning and leaving times for students.

Mr. Overly proposed changing bus regulations - pick up outside one mile radius instead of the present two mile radius

Mr. Sweetman also pursued staggering school hours and suggested changing the starting time for all students. The School Administration is exploring this possibility.

Mr. Sweetman suggested charging for parking in school lot or issuing parking permits. Mrs. Freedman believes this would only put the vehicles on residential streets, streets not designed for parking.

Mr. Sweetman solicited the School Board's feelings on opening stub streets into the school property. The School Administration will review to ascertain how many cars would use Judson if it was opened during school hours. The School Board will pursue this possibility.

Another joint Meeting will be held in 60 - 90 days to review alternatives.

Mr. Stubbs asked for coordination between the City and School system for recreation purposes.

Mr. Stubbs questioned whether the School Administration would use the swimming pool if constructed on the City's 35 acres. Mrs. Freedman suggested exploring the possibility of locating the pool on school property.

There being no further business, the Meeting was adjourned.
