Border of Centerville and Kettering was identified by Schab and Kettering Planner. Schab located ditch to north of South Brook Manor on a map (ditch in Kettering). Screening between Centerville & Drive Two Theatre was discussed.

Stubbs suggested that a policy of Council be made relative to open & free streets to & from both communities. McIntire suggested that zoning at boundaries be reviewed by planning departments to determine whether co-ordinate. Davis asked that Overbrook be opened. It was agreed that City, Finance & Staffs should work closely together in corporated areas prior to any development.

Sweetman wondered about landscaping and screening at Federal Housing Project in Kettering, screening for Citizens of Centerville. McKersie suggested a plot plan be forwarded to Centerville of this Project.

Mayor suggested that in future if a barricade is erected Fire & Police departments be advised prior to.

Mayor explained Centerville's position on I-675 - erected as soon as possible in consideration of total area and erected as journalized. Would like to see all communities make a unified effort to acquire this highway as soon as possible.

McIntire asked if Kettering would be willing to take same action as Centerville has concerning the I-675 - impact study be made with haste and the roadway constructed. Horn advised action which has been taken & additional material will be reviewed. He is amenable to having it an agenda item for Ket. Council consideration. (passing resolution for quick impact study.)

Horn advised Ket feels Mass Transit important to south of Dayton citizens. Corridor study will be on Ket Council agenda for Nov 13 Meeting. May and Horn stressed need for fuel conservation. Horn made reference to Telegram received from Richard Nixon. Horn & May agreed on joint Resolution for the conservation of fuel. Roll call in Favor.

Kettering Helicopter is available for approximately 1 hour for \$5.00 per hour (Kettering Costs) to other communities.

Horn suggested that City Manager & Chief of Police evaluate this proposal & report to Council.

Welch asked Centerville to review case of Marshall Ditch problem.
Joy advised will be reviewed with City Engineer & Municipal Attorney.

Have offered Kettering's Recreation Experience to the City of
Centerville. (Share) available to any inquiry. Welch suggested one
community providing one facility and the other another. Do not
duplicate facilities.

Davis asked for reconsideration on closing of Overbrook Drive
McKenius as for development plans. Winterhalter will meet
with Kettering to explain the situation.
