The Council of the City of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio met in Special Session, Monday, January 11, 1971 at 8:30 P.M. at the Municipal Building with Mayor Paul Hoy presiding. Councilmen present were as follows: Victor Green, Russell Sweetman, John McIntire, John Zengel, City Manager John Griffin, Director of Finance Ronald Budzik, and Clerk of Council Marilyn McLaughlin.

Mr. Griffin reviewed his proposed salaries and salary scale for the employees of the City of Centerville for the year 1971. The salaries averaged a 6.3% increase over 1970. Mr. McIntire wondered what the overall increase in dollars is for 1971 as opposed to 1970. Mr. Budzik advised that, excluding Waste Collection, the total is \$22,543.00, however, \$16,000.00 of this constitutes two additional patrolmen. Following considerable discussion, Council concurred with City Manager John Griffin's recommendation: a 6.3% increase across the board for Police Department salaried employees, and a \$ .20 per hour increase for hourly workers with starting salaries for Waste Collection employees to remain the same and increases be reviewed at a later date. Council concurred that an additional Utility Man be hired for the Street Department, starting salary to be \$3.00 per hour.

Mr. Griffin explained his 1971 Current and Capital Improvement Program. 4 TF Mr. McIntire stressed the need for traffic signals at Far Hills Avenue and North Village Drive, Johanna Drive and East Franklin Street, North Main Street and Zengel Drive, he recommended that City Manager John Griffin review with the Washington Township Trustees their intention for future traffic signalization on State Route 48.

The Meeting was then adjourned.
