The Council of the City of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio met in Special Session Monday, August 10, 1970 at 8:00 P,M. at the Municipal Building with Mayor Paul Hoy presiding. Councilmen present were as follows: Victor Green, John McIntire, J. V. Stone, Harold Wells, John Zengel, Acting City Manager James Smith, City Engineer Frank Williams, and Clerk of Council Marilyn McLaughlin.

Mrs. McLaughlin read a letter received from Mr. E. A. Sweeney, II5 West Ridgeway Road, requesting more consideration of the speeding cars problem on West Ridgeway Road. Acting City Manager James Smith advised that there will be additional enforcement when the radar equipment is repaired.

Improvement of the drainage ditch on the property behind the Activity Center was discussed by Council. Mr. Williams recommended that the Street Department move the rock lying in the ditch; mud then can be dug from the ditch and the creek bed could be moved over approximately ten feet providing the trees in the way are moved. Mr. Wells recommended that the Street Department move the rock; Mr. Zengel felt the trees should be removed by the property owner. Mr. McIntire requested that Street Superintendent George Powell get written permission from the property owner for and prior to the removal of this rock.

Mr. Smith reviewed his report concerning the joint purchase of salt through Montgomery County. He advised that the cost per ton for the 1969/70 season delivered, was \$11.85 per ton. Mr. Al Florio, County Purchasing Agent, has no advance information as to the possible increase or decrease in cost for the coming year. The City can haul salt FOB Cincinnati for \$10.21 per ton or a savings of \$1.64 per ton over Joint Purchasing. Mr. McIntire felt that the City should not commit money for salt at this time. Council agreed that the continue hauling it's own salt. Mr. Wells moved that Centerville not go to joint purchase of salt with Montgomery County at this time. Mr. Green seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Stone reviewed his discussion with Dino Gianuglou, Attorney for Centerville's present Waste Collector, and circulated a report entitled "Trash day in Centerville" prepared by Frank Hoffer. Mr. Gianuglou indicated that he would be interested in renewing the Contract on a phaze out phaze in basis with the City. They would like to limit the cans to six and no bags of grass weigh more than 20 pounds. The lack of information concerning what can and what can not be deposited in the County Incinerator was discussed; the home owner must be educated. Mr. McIntire and Mr. Wells felt that the City should go into Municipal Collection or get out of it completely. Mr. Green felt that this is a service the Municipality should provide. Street Superintendent George Powell reviewed his past experience in Waste Collection and made some suggestions. Mr. Smith was requested to secure information concerning purchase vs leasing of equipment and the legal aspects of same, for the next Council Meeting. Mr. McIntire requested that the present hauler be present at the Council Meeting on August 17, 1970. Mr. Zengel felt that the City should not subsidize for this service, the cost to the customer should cover the operational cost to the City, and the price must be competitive with the private haulers. Mr. Fred Mayer, 5548 Knollcrest Court, suggested that Municipal Waste Collection might serve as an endorcement for the Income Tax issue in November. Mr. Stone requested information concerning the actual proposed cost of Municipal Waste Collection to the City of Centerville. Mr. Andrew Morrow, 6160 Marshall Road, suggested curb as well as yard service be considered by the City and private hauler so that a comparison can be made.

Clerk of Council Marilyn McLaughlin reviewed a proposed Ordinance to amend Ordinance Number 7-70. The Ordinance reflects a pay increase for three employees and contains a retroactive clause. Mr. Wells sponsored Ordinance Number 32-70: An Emergency Ordinance To Amend Ordinance Number 7-70 Of February 16, 1970, For A Table Of Organization, Personnel Classifications, Rates of Pay, And Regulations For Employees Of The City Of Centerville, Ohio, and moved that it be adopted. Mr. Green Seconded the motion. Aroll call vote
