The Council of the City of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio, met in Special Session, Monday, February 10, 1969 at 7:30 P.M. at the Municipal Building With Mayor Paul Hoy presiding. Councilmen present were as follows: Harold Wells, John Davis, J. V. Stone, John Zengel, John McIntire, Richard Miller, City Manager John Griffin, Municipal Attorney Robert Farquhar, Engineer Frank Williams, Director of Finance Ronald Budzik, and Clerk of Council Marilyn McLaughlin.

Mayor Hoy read Resolution Number 1-69:— A Resolution Expressing Support For Preservation Of The Area Of The Northern Municipalities Of Montgomery County And Stressing The Importance Of Local Government.

WHEREAS, the welfare of the regional community requires the active participation of both the central city area and the surrounding suburbs; and

WHEREAS, we, as an autonomous suburban city recognize the need for a vital progressive central city to support the suburbs and give substance to the regional community; and

WHEREAS, we also expect due consideration by the central city for our active participation in efforts to promote the welfare of the whole community; and

WHEREAS, our continued active participation can only be assured if our local governmental character is maintained and protected:

NOW THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED, that the City of Centerville hereby supports those activities of the northern municipalities of Montgomery County, Ohio which are designed to preserve their area and maintain the strength of their local governmental character.

RESOLVED, further that the clerk is hereby directed to cause copies of this resolution to be delivered to the Mayors or City Managers of the northern municipalities of Montgomery County, Ohio.

Mr. Kenneth Freeman, 9415 Sheehan Road advised that he does not feel that Centerville has the right to pass such a Resolution in reference to the City of Dayton. He believes that the City of Dayton needs to expand to solve it's problems. Mayor Hoy advised that expansion is not the answer to Dayton's problems, and that the surrounding suburbs need support and growth.

Mr. Wells sponsored Resolution Number 1-69 and moved that it be approved. Mr. McIntire seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in seven ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Griffin reviewed a proposed ordinance for a table of organization, personnel classifications, rates of pay, and regulations for employees of the City of Centerville. Mr. McIntire requested that Mr. Griffin prepare an up to date chart showing compensation in surrounding communities. Council will study further this matter.

Mayor Hoy read a legal opinion received from Municipal Attorney Robert Farquhar concerning filling the vacancy existing on the Board of Zoning Appeals. Future action will be taken by Council.

Mayor Hoy requested clarification from Mr. Farquhar concerning the committee to meet with the Washington Township Trustees in reference to the Police Contract. Mr. Farquhar will advise.

Brother Roger Thome, St. Leonard College, appeared before Council to review the number of volunteers on the Rescue Squad. He also advised that the sewage plant at St. Leonards is not adequate, he presented a chart revealing it's capacity on individual dates.
