

Work Session

December 9, 1968

Council agreed to pay a car allowance of \$50.00 per month to the City Manager. The resolution is to be retroactive. This figure will be reviewed in six months.

Council agreed to pay the moving expenses for the City Manager.

Council agreed to partition the Engineer's Room per Milo Wilson's estimate. City Manager to report back to Council regarding a partition in the Mayor's Office.

Council discussed Future Municipal Plans. Council agreed that City Manager should talk to 2 or 3 Architects concerning the matter of whether we should add on here or should we locate somewhere else. Hagedrost is to be consulted first. Architect should be questioned as to how much space we need and how much for future plans.

Council agreed that the City Manager in his search for a Director of Law should look for someone who lives in Centerville or in Washington Township and who is interested in Centerville.

Stanley Wiseman & Robert Adams approved on Open Housing Centerville should have ordinance because:

1. Once more reaffirm that all men are created equal.
2. Has been stated policy of religious societies to support equal opportunity in housing.
3. Promise was made to consider such an ordinance and to pass such an ordinance within three months of the previous public meeting, Council should keep their word.
4. The 1866 law does not indicate what should be implemented on the local level.
5. 1968 law encourages local ordinance. Willing to give preference to local ordinances.

6. Protect people that say they are being discriminated against.
7. Federal Institutions are looking around to see that services does exist for their employees.
8. Ordinance would be a clear pattern of no discrimination.
