Mr. Lyons advised the signed contract for the 701 Urban Planning Assistance Contract has been received.

Mr. Lyons advised Council of a proposed Heritage Mall Complex submitted by the DeBartolo Company, proposed location being State Route 48 just north of Alexandersville-Bellbrook Road.

Mr. Adam Zengel appeared before Council explaining a water drainage problem that could develop at his residence if a Mall was to be erected at the proposed site.

Nayor Hoy advised Council of a Public Hearing concerning State Route at 2:00
777 to be held Friday, February 10, 1967, P.N. at the Centerville High
School Auditorium.

Mayor Hoy read correspondence received from William Yeck asking for Council's endorsement on the All County Neighborhood Park School Program. Council decided to defer this endorsement until the receipt of the Master Plan.

Mayor Hoy read correspondence received from the Centerville Lions
Club, Safety Committee concerning various hazardous conditions existing
in the Village of Centerville. Mr. McClellan speaking on behalf of the
Village Safety Committee requested the Village acquire a proposal from
The Dayton Power & Light Company regarding the cost of street lights at
intersections along State Route 48, and a letter be directed to Ohio
Department of Highways requesting a traffic count at Bradstreet and Route
48.

Mr. McClellan sponsored Ordinance #4-67, An Ordinance To Provide For The Submission To The Electors Of The Village Of Centerville, Ohio, The Question "Shall A Commission Be Chosen To Frame A Charter" And For The Election Of The Members Of The Commission.

Mr. McClellan moved that Ordinance #4-67 be given the first reading. Mr. Davis seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mayor Hoy gave Ordinance #4-67 its first reading.

Mr. McClellan moved to accept the first reading of Ordinance #4-67.
Mr. Miller seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. McClellan moved that the statutory rules and regulations for reading ordinances on three separate and distinct days be suspended and that Ordinance #4-67 be given its second and third readings by title only. Mr. Davis seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mayor Hoy gave Ordinance #4-67 its second reading by title only.

Mr. McClellan moved that the second reading of Ordinance #4-67 by title only be accepted. Mr. Berry seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mayor Hoy gave Ordinance #4-67 its third reading by title only.

Mr. McClellan moved that the third reading of Ordinance #4-67 by title only be accepted and the Ordinance be passed. Mr. Berry seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. McIntire moved that the Village of Centerville accept the bid of Mr. Buerschen for construction of the Street Department Garage, and that the Solicitor draw up the necessary contract for such purpose, contingent with the options agreed upon by the Street Committee. Mr. Miller seconded the motion. Mr. Buerschen was then introduced to Council. Mr. McIntire advised Council of Mr. Buerschen's past achievements and various recommendations. Pictures were circulated verifying the above. Mr. McIntire advised cost is contingent upon location, three locations being:

Location Number 1, cost \$6,800.00 + 24,914.85 Location Number 2, cost \$4,150.00 + 24,914.85 Location Number 3, cost \$3,350.00 + 24,914.85

After discussion Mr. McIntire added "Ceiling based on the fund remaining on the Bond Issue specifically for use on the Street Department Garage Building". A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. McIntire moved that Frank Williams act as co-ordinator between the Village of Centerville and the contractor Mr. Herman Buerschen on the Street Department Garage Project. Mr. McClellan seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

SPECIAL MEETING

The Council of the Village of Centerville, Montgomery County, Ohio met in Special Session, Monday, January 30, 1967, at 7:30 P.M. at the Municipal Building with Mayor Paul Hoy presiding. Councilmen present were as follows: Harold Berry, John McIntire, Richard Miller, John Davis, Engineer Frank Williams, Solicitor Fred Young, and Clerk-Treasurer Ronald Budzik.

Mr. McIntire reported for the Street Committee on the proposed construction of Street Garage. He advised that the Street Committee analyzed Mr. Buerschen's bid and that the Committee felt that with plans for purchasing additional needed Street Department equipment, it would be advantageous to increase the size of the new garage by using residue monies from the bond issue i. e. monies saved on the purchase of real estate from Mr. Beerman. The total cost of an enlarged garage would be \$34,680.00.

Mr. Davis reported that the excess Bond monies could be used for additional garage costs through a transfer of \$5,150.00 to the Bond. Retirement Fund. The Village would sell notes to the Bond Retirement and use this money for the additional cost of the street garage.

Mr. McIntire moved that the funds from the excess Bond monies be utilized by way of transfer of such monies to the Bond Retirement Fund from the Garage Construction Fund, the notes will be sold to the Bond Retirement fund from which such notes will be used for an addition to the
