SPECIAL MEETING

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio met in Special Session Monday, November 20, 1967 at 7:30 P.M. at the Municipal Building with Mayor Paul Hoy presiding. Councilmen present were as follows: Harold Berry, Richard Miller, John McIntire, K. C. McClellan, John Davis, Engineer Frank Williams, and Clerk-Treasurer Ronald Budzik.

The minutes of the previous meeting had been distributed prior to this meeting.

Mr. McIntire advised that the following: "Mr. McIntire felt that the three year duration of the garbage contract was not in the best interest of the Village" should be added to the minutes of November 6, 1967 before "The meeting was then adjourned."

Mr. McClellan moved that the minutes of November 6, 1967 as amended, be approved. Mr. Davis seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in five ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Charles Rush appeared before Council concerning a traffic hazard existing on East Spring Valley Road. He advised Council that four yards on the North Side of East Spring Valley Road have been almost ruined by car tracks. The Road is narrow and crowned. Mr. Rush questioned whether anything could be done to stop speeding in this area. Mr. McIntire will analyze the problem for a solution.

Mr. Budzik read a letter from the State of Ohio, Department of Highways turning down the Village's request for traffic signals at Sheehan, Bradstreet, and Spring Valley Roads. Further correspondence inviting Highway Department representatives to meet with Centerville Officials will be made.

The Council of Governments was opened for discussion by Mayor Hoy.

Mr. McIntire had many questions. Council agreed that they must decide

whether or not Centerville can benefit by being a member of this group.

Further study will be made when more information is made available to

Council.

Mayor Hoy presented to Council a request by William Leonard to vacate an alley adjacent to his property on East Franklin Street. Mr. Miller advised that making a one way alley is contrary to our Master Planner's recommendation. Mr. McIntire felt that the Street Department should reconstruct the alley and develop it to a good standard. Council agreed that the alley should either be vacated or reconstructed. Mr. McClellan suggested that Council check on Village legal rights to this property. Further sutdy will be made on this matter.

Mayor Hoy presented to Council a proposal from Mr. Jack Atkinson,
Dayton Power and Light to provide adequate lighting in the enlarged parking
area at the Municipal Building. The proposal consisted of changing two
lights and adding one at an additional cost of \$66.00 per year. Mr.

McClellan moved to put in three lumen lights and remove two lights around
the Municipal Building as proposed by Mr. Atkinson at an increased cost of
\$66.00 per year. Mr. Davis seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted
in five ayes in favor of the motion.

Mayor Hoy advised Council that Parkins, Rogers, and Associates, Inc.

Department has completed the audit of work and found it to be 30.8% complete.

Mr. McIntire read a letter from Engineer Frank Williams concerning reducing the Performance Bond to 5% for a duration of one year after acceptance of a plat instead of providing a Maintenance Bond. Mr. McIntire advised that this could cut down on needless correspondence or red tape. Mr. McIntire will work with Solicitor Fred Young concerning this matter.

Mr. McClellan advised that he had two proposals to make to Council.

1. That the salary of the Mayor and the Clerk-Treasurer be increased to \$1800.00 per year, 2. That the salary of Council be increased to \$25.00 per meeting, not to exceed \$600.00 per year. Mr. McClellan requested that this matter be put on the agenda for the next meeting and that an Ordinance be drawn by Solicitor Fred Young.
