

SPECIAL MEETING

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio, met in Special Session, Monday, April 18, 1966 at 7:30 P.M. at the Municipal Building with Mayor Paul Hoy presiding.

Councilmen present were as follows: K. C. McClellan, Harold Berry, John McIntire, John Davis, Richard Miller, Donald Lyons, Engineer Frank Williams, and Clerk-Treasurer Ronald Budzik.

The meeting was opened with an invocation given by Rev. Norvell of the Centerville First Penecost Church.

The minutes of the meeting of April 4, 1966 were read. Mr. Davis moved that the minutes be approved as read. Mr. Lyons seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mayor Hoy read a letter from Mr. Love acknowledging receipt of an application for an urban planning grant from the Housing and Urban Development Department for Centerville. He advised that processing of the application has not as yet been completed and that council will be advised when a decision is reached.

A letter was received from Mr. Lawrence Cramer who advised council that the Johanna Drive extension at Tower Heights School was not approved by the Board of Education.

A letter from Mr. Young concerning the definition of "Through-Highway" was read by Mayor Hoy. Ohio law states that all streets less than one mile in length shall have a 25 mph speed limit. After discussion by council Mayor Hoy recommended that speed limit signs be posted as soon as possible.

Mr. Williams, engineer, advised council that twelve (12) new Village Entrance Signs have been ordered.

A letter was received from the Zoning Board of Appeals which suggested amendments to sections of the existing ordinances. Discussion by council revealed that further study by council and the solicitor will be made of the recommendations.

John Davis revealed that the engineer has completed the preliminary drawings on what might be the requirements of the ordinance concerning streets which will better define the engineering specifications of streets.

Mr. McIntire reported the possible locations and the extent of study made in attempting to acquire additional land for village use.

Mayor Hoy stated that meetings were held with Mr. Beerman concerning land east of the Municipal Building who suggested that the assistance of land appraisers on both sides be used to arrive at an agreeable price. Council agreed to pursue this matter.

Engineer Frank Williams sent a letter to council regarding proposed cost estimates of paving and resurfacing the area behind the Municipal Building. Council agreed that the engineer obtain bids on the total paving and resurfacing costs to be presented to council at the earliest convenience.

Section 36.32 - 36.44 of the Code of Ordinances was discussed. Council agreed to proceed with a proclamation to enforce the ordinances pertaining to the cleaning of premises.

At the request of Mrs. Winterhalter, a Washington Township Trustee, the Mayor appointed Richard Miller to serve on the Washington Township Fire Department Committee for a period of three months (ie. May, June, and July).

As of this date no street improvement had been made in Oak Hill and the Village was still receiving complaints concerning the condition of the street. After discussion, council directed the solicitor to pursue the legal direction in obtaining improvements with the Bonding Company on the street in Oak Hill.

The meeting was then adjourned.
