### Regular Meeting

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and State of Ohio met in Regular Session, Monday, June 7, 1965 at 7:30 P.M. with Mayor William Gimbel. The meeting was held at the Town Hall. Councilmen present were, Charles Taylor, Clarence Stingley, John Theiss, Howard Griest, Richard Knierer, Kenneth McClellan, William Wiseman Solicitor and Frank Williams Engineer.

The minutes of the meeting of May 3, 1965 were read. Mr. Taylor moved that the minutes be accepted as read. Mr. Griest seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

The minutes of the meeting of May 17, 1965 were read. Mr. Griest moved that the minutes be accepted as read. Mr. Stingley seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in five ayes in favor of the motion. Mr. Theiss abstained.

The Mayor gave the Mayor's report as follows:

Mr. Stingley reported for the Police Committee. After discussion by council it was decided that Mr. Shaffers insurance (hospital) be paid until the time that Blue Cross and Blue Shield will accept Mr. Shaffer. This amount is not to exceed the present Hospital Care rate.

Mr. Knierer reported for the Street Committee. Mr. Knierer reported that a special request had been made to the State for special permission for a 25 Mile Per Hour speed limit on residential streets in Washington Park and portions of Zengel Plats.

Mr. Theiss reported for the Planning Board and read the Planning Board minutes of the meeting of May 25, 1965.
