Mr. Knierer, Chairman of the Finance Committee, moved that vouchers 340 through 371, which have been approved by the Finance Committee, be paid. Mr. Sims seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Sims moved that voucher 372, which is an advance of \$60.00 to James Smith to attend a police chiefs convention, be approved. Mr. Zengel seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mayor Gimbel introduced Richard Fisher of the Home Builders Association to the council. Mayor Gimbel set September 19, 1963 as the date for a public hearing to discuss the proposed Village building code.

Mr. Frank Zimmerman of 88 E. Franklin discussed zoning on East Franklin with the council. Mr. George Spade of 92 E. Franklin participated in the discussion.

Mr. John Theiss reported for the Planning Board. The council briefly discussed The Oak Hill Lane Cul-d-sac and Pleasant Hill Plat, Section 9.

Mr. Howard Griest reported for the Street Committee. Mr. Griest moved that the present Garage lease be renewed for one year. Mr. Knierer seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Sims reported for the Police Committee.
