Mr. Griest gave the Street Committee report.

Mr. Griest moved to send notice to property owner on the north east corner of Martha and East Drive and to Herman Weidner with reference to installation of curbing on East Drive. Mr. Knierer seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

After discussion of the bids for resurfacing the streets, Mr. Griest moved to reject all bids received for street resurfacing. Mr. Sims seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Griest moved to release The Concept Development Company from the Articles of Agreement dated March 5, 1962, Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4. Mr. Theiss seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Sims gave the Police Committee report. Mayor Gimbel read a letter from James Smith relative to Louis Campbell, the police dispatcher. Mr. Theiss moved that the letter be turned over to the Police Committee for study and recommendation. Mr. Zengel seconded the motion. A roll call vote resulted in six ayes in favor of the motion.
