A letter from the Washington Twp. Park Commission asking the Council their support for parks was read. It was moved by Mr. Knierer that the Council go on record that the question be placed on the ballot at the next special election, seconded by Mr. Niswonger and carried. A roll call resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

The Council was presented a letter accompanied by petitions from the Centerville Womens Civic Club which they protest to any further annexation to the Village of Centerville until the elected Officials of the Community establishes new regulations necessary to protect the welfare of the school and community.

Special Meeting

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of

Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in a special meeting Feb. 15, 1960 with Mayor Gimbel presiding. Present: George Niswonger, Robert Tamaska, Walter Rhoades, Dr. Kelso, Richard Knierer, Wilbur Sims of the Councilmen. Engineer Frank Williams, Solicitor Anthony Lair.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. It was moved by Mr. Niswonger, seconded by Mr. Tamaska and carried that the minutes be approved. A roll call resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

A letter from Mr. Boggs, pertaining to a fishing lake was turned over to Mr. Niswonger of the planning committee for their action and this subject shall be taken up by the Council at the next regular meeting.

The subject of the garbage and trash contract was discussed. It was decided by the Council to get together with Cox & Kinder and discuss the contract.

The D. W. I. cases was tabled until next Council meeting.

Discussion pertaining to a sewer line on East Drive took place and citizens from East Drive expressed their opinion of the sewer line, pertaining to cost and how they shall hook into the main line

The Council advised them to see the County Sanitary Dept. as to the costs etc. and perhaps have their laterals installed at the same time as the main line is installed.

The Amendment of Ord. 13-59 Section #2 was discussed. After discussion by the Council it was decided that the first of two proposal for Ord. 8-60 be passed, after the regular formality of passing the first proposal as an emergency measure the motion failed. The second proposal was read and discussed after finding the emergency measure of Ord. 8-60 omitted the Council recessed until Ord. 8-60 was retyped with the proper provision of the emergency measure included.
