

Special Meeting

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in a special meeting June 26, 1959 with Mayor Jackson presiding. Present: Bernard Cramer, Walter Rhoades, Gilbert Neubauer, Richard Neal, Frank Arnold and Rol Cultice. Solicitor James Lynn, Mr. Thiele, Engineer Leo Wall.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. It was moved by Mr. Cramer, seconded by Mr. Neal and carried that the minutes be approved. A roll call resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

The purpose of this special meeting concerned the problems of ditches and drainage in the Centerville Plat. The Engineer spoke of a storm sewer project in this plat but the cost of this would amount to approximately \$160,000.00.

Solicitor James T. Lynn then explained to the Council of the way the cost of a storm sewer project can be handled without a vote of electors. The Village can sell bonds up to 1½% of the total tax valuation of the Village but since the Village valuation is only 4½ million dollars a project of \$160,000.00 is impossible at this time.

Mr. Cultice, of the Council, then proposed the Council proceed with the program that is now taking place in this Plat and give it a chance and see if it will work. The Council unanimously agreed to this proposal.
