Public Hearing

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery, and the State of Ohio met for a Public Hearing April 28, 1958 with Mayor Jackson presiding. Present: Councilmen Gilbert Neubauer, Richard Neal, Walter Rhoades, Frank Arnold and Rol Cultice. Solicitor James T. Lynn, Engineer Leo Wall and Adam Zengle interested citizen.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the sub division rules and regulations.

After the discussion of the sub division regulation, Ord. 10-58 was introduced by Mr. Arnold being "An Ordinance of sub division regulations of Centerville, Ohio passed under the authority granted by Sec. 711.09 and Sec. 711.101 of the revised code of the State of Ohio." Mr. Neubauer made the following motion, "I move that the statutory rule for reading Resolutions and Ordinances on three separate and distinct days be dispensed with so that Ord. 10-58 may be given its second and third readings," seconded by Mr. Arnold and carried. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion. Then Ord. 10-58 was given its second and third reading. The question being shall Ord. 10-58 be passed? It was moved by Mr. Neal, seconded by Mr. Rhoades that Ord. 10-58 be passed. A roll call was ordered which resulted as follows: Mr. Neal, aye; Mr. Rhoades, aye; Mr. Neubauer, aye; Mr. Cultice, aye; Mr. Arnold, aye.

Then Ord. 10-58 passed by legal majority.

Officials Meeting

The Council of the Village of Centerville met in an Officials Meeting April 28, 1958 with Mayor Jackson presiding. Present: Councilmen Neubauer, Neal, Cultice, Arnold and Rhoades.

The purpose of this special meeting was to discuss the sewage disposal plat at the Huber Plat in the North East corner of Centerville, Ohio.

After a lengthy discussion on this subject by Mr. Huber and Mr. Packard, the Council then took action and requested from the Huber Construction Co. that before the Council enters into a Construction Contract, an Ord. shall be passed, including the following requirements;

1. That Huber Construction Co. has written approval from the State of Ohio of the plans of the disposal plant.
2. Limitations included in the Ordinance that 50 homes (maximum) can be serviced by the first \$24,000 unit.
3. Require a \$48,000 bond.

The action on this Ordinance was tabled until the next regular meeting.
