a testing laboratory as to the streets specifications after they are finished.

The question was asked about Mr. Pyper proceeding in Plat #5 on the streets. The Engineer agreed that he could proceed with Section #5 pertaining to the streets but the top coat or finish coat shall not be permitted to be put on.

Mr. Arnold then questioned the Huffman and Shawhan builders why there were homes being built without building permits? Mr. Miller who is in charge of getting the building permits for Huffman and Shawhan answered that "he was led to believe that they could proceed on an informal basis as was done before and obtain their building permits after the home was built." Thereupon the Council insisted "that from now on when ever a home is being constructed a building permit shall be posted on this building."

The Budget Committee gave their report of the budget hearing with the County Budget Committee. The County Budget Committee said that they automatically deduct the Village Street Lights that is on the proposed budget. Thereupon the Village Budget Committee recommend the only thing to do was assess the cost of the street lights to the property owemers. The Council then instructed the Solicitor to make a study of Different ways of assessments.

The meeting adjourned.
