

RESOLUTION NO. 4-19
CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMEMBER Joanne Rau ON THE 17th
DAY OF June, 2019.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO TAKE ALL STEPS NECESSARY TO EXECUTE MUTUAL AID OR ASSISTANCE AGREEMENTS WITH POLITICAL JURISDICTIONS AFFECTED BY THE MEMORIAL DAY TORNADOES TO FACILITATE RAPID, SHORT-TERM DEPLOYMENT OF EMERGENCY SUPPORT FOR CLEAN-UP FROM THE TORNADOES AND TO FACILITATE REQUESTS FOR FEMA REIMBURSEMENTS.

WHEREAS, several political jurisdictions in the Miami Valley, including, but not limited to the City of Brookville, Harrison Township, City of Trotwood, City of Dayton and City of Beavercreek on Memorial Day experienced up to at least fifteen catastrophic tornadoes causing severe damages to property in those jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, these jurisdictions suffered unprecedented damages causing large amounts of debris; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County, Ohio developed a comprehensive debris management plan and requested other jurisdictions assistance to deploy needed resources; and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville provided public works assistance in the way of trucks, equipment and man power to assist those disaster areas; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Association (FEMA) may be providing financial resources for those affected by this disaster, including financial assistance to those political jurisdictions that assisted those jurisdictions hit by the tornadoes; and

WHEREAS, FEMA requires some type of mutual aid or assistance agreements be entered into with the various jurisdictions in order to be eligible for FEMA reimbursements; and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville provided such assistance to the City of Brookville and Harrison Township upon either formal or informal agreements; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the City of Centerville to seek any reimbursement of its costs should such funds be available by FEMA.

NOW THEREFORE,


THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:

Section 1. That the City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to execute any mutual aid or assistance agreements with any political jurisdiction affected by the Memorial Day tornadoes, including, but not limited to the City of Brookville and Harrison Township.

Section 2. The City Manager and the Municipal Attorney are authorized to take all steps necessary to develop the required agreements and apply for funds provided by FEMA and take all necessary steps to facilitate the execution of such agreements in order to seek reimbursement of any available FEMA funds.


Section 3. This resolution shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law.
