RESOLUTION NO. 35-18 CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMEMBER Bill Serv ON THE 18th DAY OF June, 2018.

A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING CERTAIN AREAS OF THE CITY OF CENTERVILLE FOR UNDERGROUND PLACEMENT OF UTILITY INFRASTRUCTURE WITHIN THE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY.

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio adopted House Bill 478 on April 11, 2018, which law was signed by the Governor on May 2, 2018; and which law goes into effect on August 1, 2018, to modify the law regarding wireless service and the placement of small cell wireless facilities in the public way; and

WHEREAS, Section 4939.0314(G) of H.B. 478 allows a local municipality to adopt non-discriminatory requirements designating areas of the community solely for undergrounding of utility structures and facilities in the public way; and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville wishes to protect the health, safety, and general welfare of those areas where utility structures and facilities are currently located underground in the public way or within recorded utilities easements.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:

<u>Section 1.</u> That certain existing areas of the City of Centerville are characterized by the undergrounding of utility structures and facilities in the public way or within recorded utility easements. All utility structures and facilities proposed within the public way within and adjacent to these areas shall similarly be located underground where above-ground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 2. One such area includes the neighborhoods commonly known as 'Nestle Creek' and 'Cheltenham,' approximately bounded by the adjacent public ways of Clyo Road, Wilmington Pike, E. Alex-Bell Road/SR725, and Bigger Road within the City of Centerville and further designated in "Exhibit A." This Resolution shall apply to all public ways within and adjacent to these areas where above-ground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 3. One such area includes the neighborhood commonly known as 'Yankee Trace,' approximately bounded by the adjacent public ways of Washington Church Road, E. Social Row Road, Sheehan Road, Paragon Road, and Yankee Street within the City of Centerville and further designated in "Exhibit B." This Resolution shall apply to all public ways within and adjacent to this area where above-ground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 4. One such area includes the neighborhoods commonly known as 'Plymouth Notch,' 'Springstone Lea,' 'Park Estates,' 'Stationhouse Square,' 'Park Place,' 'East Park Place,' and 'Park Estates' located along East Centerville Station Road and further designated in "Exhibit C." This Resolution shall apply to all public ways within and adjacent to these areas where above-ground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 5. One such area includes the neighborhood commonly known as 'Franklin East,' approximately bounded by the adjacent public ways of Clyo Road, E. Centerville Station Road, and Millerton Drive within the City of Centerville and further designated in "Exhibit D." This Resolution shall apply to all public ways within and adjacent to this area where above-ground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 6. One such area includes the neighborhoods commonly known as 'Deer Run,' 'Black Oak Forest,' and 'Forest Walk' located along Clyo Road within the City of Centerville and further designated in "Exhibit E." This Resolution shall apply to all public ways within and adjacent to these areas where above-ground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 7. One such area includes the neighborhood commonly known as 'Plymouth Colony,' located along Pine Forest Drive and New London Court within the City of Centerville and further designated in "Exhibit F." This Resolution shall apply to all public ways within and adjacent to this area where above-ground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 8. One such area includes the neighborhood commonly known as 'Walnut Hills,' located west of Wilmington Pike within the City of Centerville and further designated in "Exhibit G." This Resolution shall apply to all public ways within and adjacent to this area where aboveground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 9. One such area includes the neighborhood commonly known as 'Centerville Woods,' located south of Spring Valley Pike within the City of Centerville and further designated in "Exhibit H." This Resolution shall apply to all public ways within and adjacent to this area where aboveground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 10. One such area includes the neighborhoods commonly known as 'La Chapelle' and 'Walnut Creek' located along Wilmington Pike and Alex-Bell Road within the City of Centerville and further designated in "Exhibit I." This Resolution shall apply to all public ways within and adjacent to these areas where above-ground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 11. One such area includes the neighborhoods commonly known as 'Cornerstone North' and 'Cornerstone South' bounded roughly by Wilmington Pike, Clyo Road, Brown Road, and I-675 within the City of Centerville and further designated in "Exhibit J." This Resolution shall apply to all public ways within and adjacent to these areas where aboveground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 12. One such area includes the neighborhoods commonly known as 'Pleasant Woods' along Alston Woods Court within the City of Centerville and further designated in "Exhibit K." This Resolution shall apply to all public ways within and adjacent to these areas where aboveground utility installations do not currently exist.

Section 13. This Resolution shall apply to any future area where provisions for underground utilities are made.

Section 14. A utility operator may seek a waiver to the undergrounding or alternative location requirements in accordance with state or local law.

Section 15. Section 9.13(J) of the Unified Development Ordinance which requires underground installation of utilities in new residential subdivisions is not affected by this Resolution.

Section 16. This Resolution shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law.
