**A RESOLUTION ENDORSING AN APPLICATION TO THE  
MIAMI VALLEY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION FOR  
FEDERAL STP FUNDS FOR THE RESURFACING OF VARIOUS  
THOROUGHFARES.**

WHEREAS, The City of Centerville, committed to maintaining existing thoroughfares in the City of Centerville, recognizes the need for sections of East Franklin Street and Clio Road to be resurfaced, and

WHEREAS, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission (MVRPC) has solicited local government entities to submit new transportation projects for funding consideration in the SFY2016-2019 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville has committed to a timely project development schedule; and


WHEREAS, the City of Centerville has committed the necessary resources to support the local cost portion of the projects and the following list of projects will be submitted to MVRPC, shown in order of the City of Centerville's priority from number 1 to 3.

1. East Franklin Street, from Main Street to Clio Road, with local commitment of \$174,802.27
2. Clio Road, Part 1, from Bigger Road to Wilmington Pike, with local commitment of \$242,742.99
3. Clio Road, Part 2, from Alex-Bell Road to Bigger Road, with local commitment of \$221,450.83

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:

The City of Centerville is authorized to submit applications to MVRPC as mentioned above.
