- (1) Feedwire Road (Westbound) Bus Pull-Off and Shelter; \$40,971.26 estimated total construction cost,
- (2) Accessible Pedestrian Signals at the Intersections of Main Street/Franklin Street, and Virginia Avenue/West Franklin Street; \$50,000.00 estimated total construction cost, and
- (3) Concrete Bus Pad on Southbound Clyo Road North of Alex-Bell Road; \$22,000.00 estimated total construction cost.

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville commits to a 20 percent match to the total budgeted cost or actual cost, whichever is less. The remaining portion will be funded through RTA's federal 5307 formula allocation.

Project Summary


The City of Centerville requests grant funding for the following project: Feedwire Road (Westbound) Bus Pull-Off. The purpose of the project will provide a safe, secure, and accessible bus stop on a busy Feedwire Road to service large existing and proposed developments. The project is to include a bus pull-off and a gazebo shelter. The design and construction of the bus pull-off will be coordinated with the Feedwire Road Improvements project and includes road widening, storm sewer and construction of additional sidewalks. The construction of the gazebo shelter will be constructed under a separate contract. Maps and photographs are included for illustration.

Project Implementation Schedule

Coordinating with the Feedwire Road Improvements project, a contingent design is underway for the bus pull-off. If awarded funding, the construction of the bus pull-off would be included with the construction of the road widening, which has an anticipated completion date of October 31, 2014. The gazebo shelter would be constructed under a separate contract, and would be completed within twelve months of the contract award date, and likely before October 31, 2014.

Project Budget Report

The estimated construction cost of the project is \$40,971.26. A detailed Engineer's Estimate is included. Reference the attached 2014-2018 Capital Improvement Program Sheet for SS-16: Feedwire Road Improvements. The project originated after the CIP was approved, but it will be included for funding in 2014. A Certification of Availability of Funds is attached.







Concrete Bus Pad






Concrete Bus Pad on Southbound Clyo Road North of Alex-Bell Road
