20th DAY OF June, 2005.

A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE MIAMI VALLEY
COMMUNICATIONS COUNCIL POLICY BOARD TO SUPPORT A
TWENTY PERCENT (20%) REBATE OF THE CABLE FRANCHISE FEES
FOR THE 2006 CALENDAR YEAR

WHEREAS, The City of Centerville is a member of the Miami Valley Communications Council (MVCC) and currently contributes (100%) of its cable franchise fees to support the Miami Valley Communications Council; and

WHEREAS, the MVCC members have had recent discussions concerning the financial operations and budget of MVCC and a possible reduction in the collection of franchise fees, which could affect the operations of MVCC; and

WHEREAS, The City of Centerville is committed to support the MVCC; but wants to monitor the financial status of the organization; and

WHEREAS, The City of Centerville desires to support a (20%) rebate of all franchise fees, contingent upon a majority of the other member Cities of the MVCC supporting the same initiative.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY
RESOLVES, THAT:


SECTION 1. The City of Centerville encourages the MVCC Policy Board to grant a 20% rebate to its member cities of their respective franchise fees collected for the calendar year 2006. This support is contingent upon a majority of the member Cities of the MVCC also supporting such a rebate.

SECTION 2. The City of Centerville shall continue to monitor the financial status of the MVCC to determine if future annual rebates should be planned and adopted.
