**RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE GREATER DAYTON COMPACT
PRINCIPLES AS APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF
THE MIAMI VALLEY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION**

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission has approved a set of Regional Principles developed to serve as a framework for action that will guide, but not prescribe, regional and local planning and decision making; and

WHEREAS, prior to adopting the Principles, the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission sought and incorporated input from a broad variety of local elected officials, the business community and the general public regarding the aforementioned Principles; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Centerville has reviewed this set of Principles and agrees that these Principles provide a conceptual structure that reflect and promote the best interests of the individual communities and citizens of the Region.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY
RESOLVES THAT:**

SECTION 1. That Regional Principles approved by the Board of MVRPC be and are hereby endorsed and supported by the Municipality of Centerville; and

SECTION 2. That copies of this Resolution be provided to the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission and included with the other endorsements of the Greater Dayton Compact Principles on the MVRPC web site.
