A RESOLUTION RATIFYING THE ACTION TAKEN BY THE CITY MANAGER TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR A COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT TO PROVIDE HANDICAP ACCESSIBILITY IN THE ARCHITECTURAL PRESERVATION DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, The Montgomery County Board of Commissioners is accepting applications for Fiscal Years 2003, 2004, and 2005 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) projects, and

WHEREAS, It was the intent of the City of Centerville to apply for a (CDBG) grant to provide for handicap accessibility in the Architectural Preservation District.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:

- Section 1. That the action taken by the City Manager be and is hereby ratified to submit an application to the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners for a Community Development Block (CDBG) grant to provide for handicap accessibility in the Architectural Preservation District, a copy of which is attached hereto, marked as exhibit "A".
- Section 2. That the City Manager is hereby directed to enter into subsequent contracts, all understanding and assurances contained therein, to act in connection with the submission of the application and subsequent contracts, and to provide such additional information as may be required.
- Section 3. That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon passage.

PROJECT NAME: Downtown Handicap Access

APPLICANT: City of Centerville

II. PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Downtown Redevelopment Project has been undertaken by the City to encourage redevelopment and building reuse opportunities in the historic downtown district. As part of that project, the City has purchased two strategic properties in the district as well as partnering on a third property with the goal of providing economic stimulus and increasing the availability and accessibility of public parking in Downtown Centerville.

Concurrent with the redevelopment of the parking areas will be several improvements to the streetscape in that area as well as the intersection of State Route 48 (Main Street) and State Route 725 (Franklin Street). These improvements are intended to correct existing deficiencies that exist regarding accessibility for physically challenged/handicapped individuals. This is the first step in making the entire downtown district compliant with the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA). The improvements are as follows:

- 1. Installation of four (4) ADA-compliant ramps in the redeveloped public parking areas. The exact location of the ramps will be dependent upon the final design of the parking areas. There is currently only one (1) handicap-accessible parking space in this area.
- 2. Installation of ADA-compliant audible pedestrian signals at each of the four (4) corners of the intersection of Main and Franklin Streets.
- 3. Reconstruction of the current ramps at the intersection of Main and Franklin Streets. The current ramps are only in partial compliance with ADA.

Impact/Benefit (How many persons/households served? How many linear feet? Etc.)

This project will affect:

255 linear feet of crosswalk

140 square feet of existing handicapped ramps 160 square feet of new handicapped ramps

The improvements will enhance and in some cases introduce facilities in areas that were previously inaccessible or inconvenient for physically challenged/handicapped individuals. The project is estimated to directly benefit approximately 3,897 sensory and physically disabled persons in Centerville and Washington Township (Source: U.S. Census 2000). Physically challenged/handicapped individuals who do not live in the area but use the facilities will benefit as well.

An indirect benefit of accessibility improvements is the increased employment opportunities that would be available for physically challenged/handicapped individuals. Persons who were previously obstructed from working at certain businesses due to inaccessible public facilities would now be able to seek employment at those businesses.

III. PROJECT GOALS:

- 1. Provide safe and equal access for all persons in Downtown Centerville by eliminating barriers to the physically challenged/handicapped and supporting redevelopment and improvement of non-ADA compliant facilities to bring them into compliance with federally mandated ADA regulations.
- 2. Expend \$82,696 (est.) toward redevelopment/improvement projects in Fiscal Year 2004 consistent with Goal 1.

Project Evaluation (Describe methods used to evaluate project when completed, such as actual versus projected quantities, persons and/or households served, etc.; provide a quantitative and qualitative projection of the impact on neighborhood)

Projects of this nature are not easily quantifiable for purposes of evaluation. Perhaps the best tool to evaluate this project would be to simply observe the ease by which physically challenged/handicapped individuals use the facilities. Other factors that could be evaluated include the frequency of use and impact on general safety (studying accident trends pertaining to vehicle/pedestrian/wheelchair conflicts both before and after the improvements).


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
