WHEREAS, A Federal Fund Application has been submitted to the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission for the resurfacing of the existing asphalt roadway of Clyo Road including pavement grinding, repair of failed pavement areas, placement of a stress absorbing membrane interlayer and minor repairs to other roadway items for a total distance of 1.03 miles.
