> A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE PROPOSED ANNEXATION OF PROPERTY CONTAINING 0.276 ACRES MORE OR LESS FROM WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, OHIO TO THE CITY OF CENTERVILLE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, OHIO PURSUANT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF REVISED SECTION 709.031 (B) OHIO REVISED CODE.

WHEREAS, Centerville has received a notice from the agent for the petitioners that a hearing on a Petition to Annex 0.276 acres more or less from Washington Township, Montgomery County, Ohio to the City of Centerville has been set for hearing before the Board of County Commissioners of Montgomery County on the 15th day of August, 2000; and

WHEREAS, said section of the Ohio Revised Code requires that, upon receiving said notice, a municipal legislative authority shall, by ordinance or resolution, adopt a statement indicating what services, if any, the municipal corporation will provide to the territory proposed for annexation upon annexation; and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville is ready, willing and able to provide a superior level of service to the territory proposed for annexation upon annexation as well as other commitments and assurances to the petitioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:

Section 1. That the City of Centerville will provide the same level of police, refuse collection, public services and other necessary services to the area proposed for annexation upon annexation as it supplies to the remainder of the City.
