SPONSORED BY COUNCILMEMBER SUSZKIEWICZ ON THE 21st
DAY OF June, 1999.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSAL OF TEN USED BULLET PROOF VESTS BY THE SALE OF SAME FOR THE SUM OF \$1.00 TO SINCLAIR COMMUNITY COLLEGE, A PUBLIC BODY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF §212.05 OF THE CENTERVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE.

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville presently owns twenty level two bullet proof vests that have exceeded the allowed service life for daily use by police officers of three to five years; and

WHEREAS, a member of the faculty of the Sinclair Community College's Basic Police Academy has requested the donation of ten of said vests to be used for training purposes only; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to §212.05 of the Centerville Municipal Code (the "Code") the City is permitted to negotiate a sale of surplus equipment to other units of government or public bodies without the necessity of following the procedure set forth in Chapter 212 of the Code; and

WHEREAS, the Council hereby determines that the fair price for the sale of said equipment to Sinclair Community College is \$1.00 because its citizens are likely to benefit from the training provided to potential police officers; and


WHEREAS, Sinclair Community College is a public body within the contemplation of §212.05 of the Code.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:


Section 1. That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to carry out the provisions of the preamble hereof and to convey said surplus property to Sinclair Community College.
