A RESOLUTION DISCLAIMING INTEREST OF THE CITY
OF CENTERVILLE UNDER THE THOMAS STOLZ WILL.

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville was named as a defendant in the will construction action of Thomas Stolz bequeathing the City five percent of the net value of the estate on the condition that it commenced the construction of a swimming pool in the southeast corner of the Leonard E. Stubb's Memorial Park on Spring Valley Road within five years of the date of Tom Stolz's death, and


WHEREAS, the bequest in the approximate amount of \$10,000.00 will lapse if construction is not started by March 23, 1998, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Centerville has determined not to proceed with the construction of said swimming pool within the specified period of time.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY
RESOLVES:


