SPONSORED BY COUNCILMEMBER BROOKS COMPTON ON THE
18th DAY OF MARCH, 1996.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN
THE 1996 COMPACT OF GREEN.

WHEREAS, in 1996 communities in Montgomery and Greene Counties will celebrate the 200th anniversary of the founding of their territory located in the Dayton Metropolitan area; and

WHEREAS, this celebration will leave a legacy from this generation for the benefit and enjoyment of future generations and residents; and

WHEREAS, the forests and prairies of the valley have given way to industry, homes and roadways; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed desirable to enhance green space in ways that link communities, neighborhoods and people; and

WHEREAS, the 1996 Compact of Green calls on area communities, institutions and individuals to commemorate this event and our mutual connections by establishing bicentennial groves, "ways" and prairies.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY
RESOLVES:

SECTION 1. That the City of Centerville formally and officially joins the Compact of Green, sponsored by Celebration Dayton '96, the region's bicentennial, through its continuing policy to provide walkways and bikeways linking neighborhoods and communities, as this community's contribution to the Legacy of Green.

SECTION 2. That the "Trees for Newborns" program sponsored by the Centerville-Washington Township Bicentennial Commission is a project which contributes to the Bicentennial's Legacy of Green.

SECTION 3. That the City of Centerville agrees to work in partnership with other governments, institutions and individuals to spread green space throughout the area, especially along riverways, bikeways, roadways, walkways and pathways for the bicentennial year and in the future.
