A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURE OF UP TO\$2,500.00 FOR THE ERECTION OF AN ART SCULPTURE COMMEMORATING THE FOUNDING OF THE CENTERVILLE-WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP COMMUNITY.

- WHEREAS, in January, 1994, the Centerville Arts Commission approved sponsorship of an art sculpture contest to commemorate the founding of Centerville and Washington Township in 1796, and
- WHEREAS, since that time a contest has been held, and a sculpture selected to be situated in front of the Centerville Library, to be the first permanent example of outdoor, public art in the Community, leaving a legacy for future generations to enjoy, and
- WHEREAS, though many grants have been applied for and received for the erection of the art sculpture, additional financial assistance remains necessary from the City of Centerville, Washington Township and the Centerville-Washington Township Public Library.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES THAT:

- SECTION 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the City of Centerville to provide an additional expenditure of up to \$2,500.00 for the completion of the sculpture to be erected in front of the Centerville Library in 1996.
- SECTION 2. This Resolution shall become effective at the earliest date allowed by law.
