A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF CENTERVILLE, TO MAKE APPLICATION TO THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING SERVICES FOR A COPS FAST HIRING GRANT.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services, has made available applications for COPS FAST hiring grants for jurisdictions serving populations of under 50,000; and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville desires to make application for said COPS FAST hiring grant.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:

SECTION 1. That the City Manager is hereby legally and officially authorized to apply for a COPS FAST hiring grant to the United States Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services, by application marked exhibit "A", attached hereto and made a part hereof, and is further authorized to act on behalf of the City of Centerville with respect to any issues that may arise during processing of this application.

SECTION 2. This Resolution shall become effective at the earliest date allowed by law.
