A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CHANGE ORDER TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXTENSION OF A SANITARY SEWER LINE IN CONNECTION WITH THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE YANKEE TRACE GOLF COURSE PROJECT.

WHEREAS, by Resolution Number 27-92 the City Manager of Centerville, Ohio was authorized to enter into a contract in the amount of \$3,538,444, with Irvin Construction Company, Inc., of Fisherville, Kentucky, for the construction of Yankee Trace Golf Course, and

WHEREAS, upon termination of the services of Irvin Construction Company, the City of Centerville entered into a contract with Ohio Farmers Insurance Company for the completion of performance under said construction contract, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is necessary that additional work be performed in conjunction with this project in the amount of \$63,000.00 to provide for the extension of a sanitary sewer line to service the Yankee Trace Clubhouse and Maintenance Facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:

SECTION 1. That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to execute a change order with the Ohio Farmers Insurance Company in the amount of \$63,000.00 to provide for the extension of a sanitary sewer line to service the Clubhouse and Maintenance Facility associated with the Yankee Trace Golf Course.

SECTION 2. This Resolution shall become effective at the earliest date allowed by law.
