

RESOLUTION NO. 23-90  
CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMEMBER Sally Beels ON THE 16th  
DAY OF July, 1990.

A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE CONTINUATION OF  
VOTER REGISTRATION BY AGENCIES IN THE CITY OF  
CENTERVILLE, OHIO.

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville encourages the participation of  
all its citizens in civic and public affairs; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes that the full participation of its  
citizens is necessary for the effective governance and  
the civic health of the community; and

WHEREAS, there remain numerous citizens who are disqualified from  
full participation in community life because they are  
not registered to vote; and

WHEREAS, in a governmental system that derives its powers from  
the consent of the governed full participation in civic  
affairs is a worthwhile goal; and

WHEREAS, City governmental agencies provide vital services and  
strive to maintain personal contact with the citizens;  
and

WHEREAS, Ohio law already provides for voter registration to be  
provided in public high schools, through State of Ohio  
motor vehicle registrars, through the Secretary of State  
and members of the General Assembly, and that Ohio law  
is nonpartisan in recording voter information on the  
State or City registration forms; and

WHEREAS, the Governor and Secretary of State have recognized the  
problem of nonparticipation in elections and encouraged  
City governments in Ohio to "deputize City employees who  
come into frequent contact with the public.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES,  
THAT:

SECTION 1. All City agencies and their respective  
employees are directed to continue to provide voter registration  
services--at no cost to the people of Centerville.


SECTION 2. Each agency is instructed to work with the  
Ohio Secretary of State to develop procedures to implement voter  
registration programs in concert with the agency's service to the  
public.

SECTION 3. Each agency is instructed to coordinate with and through the Secretary of State and the Montgomery County Board of Elections appropriate procedures for training City employees in the voter registration process.

SECTION 4. Each agency is instructed to coordinate with the Secretary of State or the County Board of Elections the process of deputizing employees and obtaining registration materials.

SECTION 5. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon passage.
