A RESOLUTION TO AMEND RESOLUTION 30-88 IN ITS ENTIRETY AND TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE ALLOCATION OF INCOME TAX RECEIPTS RECEIVED ON AND AFTER JUNE 1, 1989 BETWEEN THE GENERAL FUND, STREET CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE FUND, CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS FUND, CENTRAL VEHICLE PURCHASE FUND, GENERAL INSURANCE DEDUCTIBLE TRUST FUND, AND CAPITAL INVESTMENTS TRUST FUND OF THE CITY OF CENTERVILLE.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:

SECTION 1. Resolution 30-88 passed December 19, 1988 is hereby repealed in its entirety and substituted with the following:

SECTION 2. From all Municipal Income Tax receipts received by the City, the following allocation is hereby to be made between the General Fund, Street Construction and Maintenance Fund, Capital Improvements Fund, Central Vehicle Purchase Fund, General Insurance Deductible Trust Fund and Capital Investments Trust Fund.

To the General Fund - Fifty-nine and five tenths (59.5) percent,

To the Street Construction and Maintenance Fund - Seven and three tenths (7.3) percent,

To the Capital Improvements Fund - Twenty and eight tenths (20.8) percent,

To the Central Vehicle Purchase Fund - Seven and four tenths (7.4) percent,

To the General Insurance Deductible Trust Fund - Five tenths (.5) percent,

To the Capital Investments Trust Fund - Four and five tenths (4.5) percent.

SECTION 3. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to take all necessary action in order to carry out the allocations.
