

RESOLUTION NO. 52-80

CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN Doelker ON THE 20th  
DAY OF October, 1980.

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE NEED FOR THE REMEDIAL WORK NECESSARY FOR COMPLETION OF THE MIAMI VALLEY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION AREAWIDE WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN AND AUTHORIZING PAYMENT OF CENTERVILLE'S SHARE OF THE COST OF SAID SUPPORT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$607.80.

WHEREAS, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission (MVRPC) has completed a Section 208 Areawide Water Quality Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, the United States and the Ohio Environmental Protection Agencies (USEPA, OEPA) in reviewing said plan identified certain deficiencies requiring remedial work; and

WHEREAS, MVRPC by Resolution adopted September 24, 1980, has agreed to carry out a Section 208 Areawide Water Quality Management Plan Remedial Work Program, such work commencing October 1, 1980, at a cost of \$225,439; and

WHEREAS, MVRPC has requested special funding assistance for the remedial work from its membership in the amount of \$100,000 and has committed \$87,439 from its Fiscal Year 1981 and 1982 general revenues to the remedial work program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville does hereby recognize that the consequences of not undertaking the remedial work as potentially severe for the entire region,

NOW THEREFORE, the municipality of Centerville here resolves:

SECTION 1. To support said remedial efforts by MVRPC by contributing Centerville's share of \$607.80, one half to be paid on January 1, 1981, and one half to be paid on January 1, 1982.


