

RESOLUTION NO. 22-78

CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN Leonzard Stubbs ON THE 6th DAY
OF March, 1978.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER
TO FILE A PROJECT APPLICATION WITH THE OHIO DISASTER
SERVICES AGENCY AND DESIGNATING THE CITY MANAGER AS
CENTERVILLE'S OFFICIAL REPRESENTATIVE.

WHEREAS, on January 26, 1978, President Carter declared an emergency
for the State of Ohio; the purpose of this declaration was to provide
Federal assistance for emergency snow removal, and

WHEREAS, the Administrator, Federal Disaster Assistance Administra-
tion (FDAA), has authorized Federal grants to local governments under
specific conditions, and

WHEREAS, the City of Centerville is desirous of making application
for such grants;

NOW THEREFORE,

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:


Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to
file a project application with the Ohio Disaster Services Agency, a copy of
which is attached hereto, incorporated herein and marked Exhibit "A",
including all understandings and assurances contained therein, and designating
the City Manager as the official representative for the City of Centerville,
Ohio.



TO ALL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, MAYORS, TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES
AND PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT ADMINISTRATORS:

On January 26, 1978, at the request of Governor Rhodes, President Carter declared an emergency for the State of Ohio. The purpose of this declaration was to provide Federal assistance for emergency snow removal.

The Administrator, Federal Disaster Assistance Administration (FDAA), has authorized Federal grants to local governments and to public school systems under the following specific conditions:

- (1) Such grants for emergency snow removal shall be for 75% of actual costs eligible under Public Law 93-288 of snow removal performed by the local governments or public school systems under contract or purchase order within five days after the declaration date, i.e. January 27, 1978 through January 31, 1978 inclusive. You will not be reimbursed for any such work not actually performed during this specified period.
- (2) Such grants are further limited to that emergency snow removal which the head of local government, or its authorized representative, (or, in the case of public school systems, the administrative head of such system or his authorized representative) determines necessary to save lives or to protect public health and safety, including opening emergency access for restoration of essential public services disrupted by the snow.
- (3) For public school systems, FDAA has announced that only those areas essential for safe access to the school for students and employees are to be considered eligible for snow removal cost reimbursement. Playing fields, playgrounds, and other areas not necessary for such access are not eligible.

You should be aware, also, that FDAA will not approve any grants where the amount of the grant will be less than \$100.00. In other words, if 75% of your eligible cost comes to less than \$100.00, you are not eligible, and need not apply.

Since these Federal grants are subject to the above limitations, you will have to decide whether or not your local government is eligible and should apply.

If you decide to make an application for this Federal grant assistance, you must apply in person, bringing the required supporting documentation and the enclosed letter addressed to the Governor's Authorized Representative to the designated Application Processing Center in accordance with the attached schedule. You must bring the original of all documents, and a copy if possible. We will have a copying machine available, however, if you cannot bring a copy. We will keep the copy and allow you to retain the original.

Actual costs during the five-day period must be established by dates and corresponding costs shown on the invoices and billings which you must bring with you to the Application Processing Center. Sand, salt and material expenses are not eligible for reimbursement under this program.



Once your application and evidence of expense have been received and approved at the Application Processing Center, Ohio Disaster Services Agency will process your project application and follow through to obtain final payment of your claim.

IMPORTANT NOTE: There is a possibility that widespread flooding or power outages resulting from the current energy emergency could force some changes in the attached schedule. If so, we will of course make public announcements of any necessary schedule changes, but may not be able to reach everyone directly. Accordingly, if flooding, power outages, or some other major disaster occurs, we urge you to call us on the above listed toll-free number to confirm whether or not the schedule has been changed.
