A RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR USE BY THE
CENTERVILLE/WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP BICENTENNIAL
COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, the Centerville/Washington Township Bicentennial Commission, a commission duly established by the Centerville City Council with members being appointed thereto by the Centerville City Council, has submitted a request for financial assistance in connection with its activities for the celebration of the bicentennial in the City of Centerville; and

WHEREAS, said Commission has proposed that the City of Centerville and Washington Township contribute to the funding of the activities for the citizens of the two jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Centerville is of the opinion that said activities are appropriate activities on behalf of the City of Centerville in connection with the celebration of the bicentennial by its citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE,

THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE HEREBY RESOLVES:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the contingency fund the amount of \$ 715.00 for use by the Centerville/Washington Township Bicentennial Commission in connection with the celebration of the bicentennial in the City of Centerville.

Section 2. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to take any steps necessary in order to effectuate the provisions of this resolution.
