

RESOLUTION NO. 25-74

CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN Charles McCune ON THE 20th DAY OF
May, 1974.

A RESOLUTION INDICATING INTENT TO JOIN WITH OTHER GENERAL PURPOSE UNITS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT WITHIN THE MIAMI VALLEY REGION TO DEVELOP AND SUPPLEMENT A PLAN RESULTING IN A COORDINATED WASTE TREATMENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR THE MIAMI VALLEY REGION.

WHEREAS, Amendments pursuant to Section 208 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act of 1972, public law 92-500, hereinafter called the Act, the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has promulgated guidelines for identification of those areas which, as the result of urban industrial concentration or other factors, have substantial water quality control problems (40CFR, Part 126), and

WHEREAS, the Miami Valley Region, hereinafter called the Area, satisfies the criteria contained in the Act and guidelines and designation of the Area pursuant to the Section 208 of those guidelines is desirable, and

WHEREAS, Section 126.10 of the guidelines requires, among other things, that the affected general purpose units of local government in the problem area must show their intent to formally adopt a resolution, to chart together in the planning process, to develop and implement a plan which will result in a coordinated Waste Treatment Management System for the Area, and

WHEREAS, such planning process and Waste Treatment Management System is necessary as a significant measure to control present point and non-point water pollution and to guide and regulate future development and those in the Area which may affect water quality in order to best abate and solve existing and potential substantial water quality control problems, and

WHEREAS, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission has already been designated as the Regional Planning and Development Organization responsible for areawide planning and coordination in the Area now;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE:


That The City of Centerville, recognizing that the Miami Valley Region has substantial water quality control problems, supports the designation of the Area pursuant to Section 208 of the Act and the EPA guidelines; and

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the City of Centerville, through its membership in the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission has joined together with other affected general purpose units of local government within the boundaries of the Area to develop and implement a growth plan which will result in a coordinated Waste Treatment Management System for the Area, among other growth strategies, and

RESOLVED FURTHER, that inasmuch as the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is a single representative organization consisting of elected officials of local government, the City of Centerville supports its efforts in carrying out the intent of Section 208 of the Act.


RESOLVED FURTHER, that all proposals for grants for construction of publicly owned treatment works within the boundaries of the designated area will be consistent with the approved plan and will be made only by the designated management agency.


