

RESOLUTION NO. 14-73

SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN John Devic ON THE 2ND DAY OF APRIL, 1973.

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING REDUCTION OF THE SPEED LIMIT ON STATE ROUTE 48 BETWEEN ALEXANDERSVILLE-BELLBROOK ROAD AND WHIPP ROAD, IN THE CITY OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

WHEREAS, a request has been made to this Council that the statutory vehicular speed limit established by Section 4511.21, Revised Code of Ohio, is greater than that considered reasonable and safe on State Route 48 between Alexandersville-Bellbrook Road and Whipp Road; and

WHEREAS, this Council has caused to be made an engineering and traffic investigation upon the section of road described above; and


WHEREAS, it is the belief of this Council that said investigation confirms the allegation that the statutory speed limit of 50 m.p.h. is unrealistic;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE THAT:

Section 1. By virtue of the provisions of Section 4511.21, Revised Code of Ohio, the Director of Highways is hereby requested to review the engineering and traffic investigation and to determine and declare a reasonable and safe prima facie speed limit on State Route 48 between Alexandersville-Bellbrook Road and Whipp Road in the City of Centerville, Ohio,


Section 2. That when this Council has been advised that the Director of Highways has determined and declared a reasonable and safe speed limit on the section of road described in Section 1 hereof, standard signs, properly posted and giving notice thereof will be erected.
