A RESOLUTION REQUESTING A CONGRESSIONAL INVESTIGATION OF  
THE CHEVY CHASE APARTMENT DEVELOPMENT.

WHEREAS, it appears to the Council that the proposed Chevy Chase Apartment Development may not serve the best interests of the citizens of Centerville or the surrounding community based upon information appearing in an April 13, 1972 article in the Dayton Journal Herald; and

WHEREAS, it further appears from said article that William Jolley, Director of the Cincinnati Region of the Federal Housing Authority has expressed opposition to the extent that he was willing to risk his position as Director because of his opposition; and

WHEREAS, the allegations of said article, if true, indicate a questionable use of taxpayer's money;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MUNICIPALITY OF CENTERVILLE:

THAT, the Mayor and City Manager be authorized and directed to communicate with the Representative to Congress for the 3rd Congressional District of Ohio and the two United States Senators from Ohio and request a congressional investigation of the Chevy Chase Apartment and its apparent approval by FHA, in the light of the allegation of said article and to send a copy of this resolution to said member of Congress and Senators.
