

RESOLUTION NO. 11-70
CITY OF CENTERVILLE

A RESOLUTION DECLARING IT NECESSARY TO LEVY A TAX IN EXCESS OF THE TEN MILL LIMITATION.


WHEREAS, The amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten mill limitation will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of said City of Centerville, Montgomery County, Ohio; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the Council of the City of Centerville, Montgomery County, Ohio, two-thirds of all members elected thereto concurring, that it is necessary to levy an additional tax in excess of the ten mill limitation for the benefit of City of Centerville for the purpose of Police Department Maintenance and Operation at a rate not exceeding 1 mill for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to 10 cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation for 5 years and, be it further

RESOLVED, That said levy be placed upon the tax lists of the current tax year in compliance with the provisions of Section 5705.34, current tax duplicate starting with first half collection, if the majority of the electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof; and, be it further


RESOLVED, That the Clerk of this Council of the City of Centerville be and she is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections, Montgomery County, Ohio, prior to the Fifteenth day of September 1970, and notify said Board of Elections to cause notice of election on the question of levying said tax to be given as required by law.


