WHEREAS, the City of Centerville has appointed a director for its recreation program; and


WHEREAS, the said director has submitted a plan for a recreation program, including a summer recreation program; and





SUMMER PROGRAM
CENTERVILLE RECREATION DEPARTMENT

The main objective of the Centerville Recreation Department is to give people of all ages an opportunity to participate in recreational activities. We will endeavor to meet this objective by offering to the citizens of Centerville a variety of recreational programs.

The summer program will open on June 16th and continue until August 8th. This program will consist of three playgrounds (Concept Park, Village South Park, Red Coach Park) whose activities will be aimed at the six to sixteen year age group. It is our aim to have three hundred and fifty children registered for the summer program.

Each park will be supervised by two playground leaders. These leaders will be on duty from nine until five. Our playground program will be broken down into three separate but interdependent parts: day to day activities, playground special events, and city wide special events. Examples of each of the three parts are:
