CERTIFY AS TO MAXIMUM MATURITY OF BONDS

The Council of the Village of Centerville, Montgomery County, Ohio, met in regular session on the 6th day of July, 1964 at the regular place of meeting, with the following members present: Rechard Knures Charles Laylar, Nourse Griest, Clarence Sturyly, mayne Himbel & Eleck Brown

Mr. Howard Gried moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, this Council contemplates the issuance of bonds in the sum of \$35,000 for the purpose of constructing a municipal building, and furnishing and equipping the same, including landscaping and development of sites, of which \$30,000 will be used for construction and \$5,000 for furniture and equipment, and landscaping and development of sites.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, Ohio, that the Clerk of this village, as fiscal officer, be and he is hereby requested to certify to this Council the estimated life of the improvement to be made with the proceeds of the sale of said bonds, and the maximum maturity of said bonds as provided in Sections 133.20 and 133.21 of the Uniform Bond Law of the Ohio Revised Code.
